MALAYSIA'S E&E INDUSTRY CELEBRATES 50TH ANNIVERSARY

Kuala Lumpur, 30 May 2022

The 50th anniversary of the E&E industry was marked today with a Gala Celebration Dinner event attended by close to 300 members of the industry including captains of the E&E industry, key government agencies and ambassadors from various countries.

Organised by the Malaysia Semiconductor Industry Association (MSIA) and supported by the Malaysian Investment Development Authority (MIDA) and the Malaysia Productivity Corporation (MPC), the Guest of Honour was Dato' Seri Mohamed Azmin Ali, Senior Minister of Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI). Other VVIPs included Dato' Sri Mustapa Mohamed, the Minister in the Prime Minister's Department (Economy) and Datuk Senator Lim Ban Hong, Deputy Minister of Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI).

Dato' Seri Wong Siew Hai, President of MSIA, in his welcome address, congratulated the industry for celebrating 50 years of excellence in Malaysia.
